Mr. Ogbole has been called the, "inventor of soilless farming in Nigeria," and it's true that he is a firm believer in the productive capabilities of soilless, vertical farming. He co-founded PS Neutraceuticals (PS Nutrac) in 2016, with the idea of implementing "cutting edge agricultural technologies for efficiency in food production to ensure food security."

The <u>PS Nutrac</u> website has become a good source of industry information for those interested in the Nigerian and Africa-wide agtech scene. Through their subsidiary PS Farms, Ogbole and his partner O.P. Okocha, Jr. build, manage and maintain farms that use aeroponics to grow premium crops that cater to local and international markets. They are now working on integrating smart sensor technology to ensure consistent feedback from the plants.
