Problem Statement:

Africa's population is growing rapidly: currently standing at 1.2 billion people, this number is estimated to double in the next 30 years. Urbanisation is also on the rise: 45% of people currently reside in urban areas, of which 60% live in overcrowded & under-serviced areas. In 2050, Africa will have 2.4 billion people, of which 65% will be in urban areas. Complicating this problem, food production in Africa is slower than population growth and has declined per capita since the 1970s. Furthermore, Africa's climate is warming 1.5 times faster than other continents. (Source: The World Economic Forum).
